At LMC we are committed to providing our students with an excellent learning experience. Our vocational courses prepare students for careers, as well as progression into Higher Education. We work alongside local and national employers to ensure our learners develop essential employability skills and, as a strategic partner in the Eden Project North, we are driving a whole education system change across the Morecambe Bay area.

2. Our courses offer a great choice of options

Vocational Qualifications versus A-Levels?

One question we get asked a lot is 'what is the difference between doing A-Levels and doing a vocational qualification at college?' A vocational qualification, which is what we offer at LMC, is great for those learners who prefer 'handson' learning and coursework rather than exams; that's not to say there won't be exams, but there will be a mix of practical and written assessments. All of our courses are led by qualified teaching professionals, with industry experience, ensuring that a balance of academic theory and practical work is achieved.

In contrast, A-Levels are theorybased and feature more exams. Whilst most believe they need to have A-Levels to gain a university education, this is not the case.

Both types of qualification are highly respected by employers and universities and equate to the relevant UCAS points required to apply to university.



We have excellent links with employers and are working in partnership with Eden Project Learning, EDF and Lancaster University to continue to develop an innovative and challenging curriculum, which will equip our learners with essential employability skills, alongside their qualifications.

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3. We support our learners

Coming to College is an exciting time; students will meet lots of new people as well as study a course that they are really interested in.



The team in The Hex is dedicated to helping your son/daughter make the most of their time at College including course and career advice, travel, study and financial help.

Learning Resources

We have a fully resourced Student &Learning Centre where our students have access to a range of resources to help them with assignment work. Knowledgeable staff available to help at all times.

Learning Support

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We work with students to identify how to support them best, and agree where reasonable adjustments will help them to study and achieve. Welcome to the LMC community

The local community is vital to us and we want you to know how important your role is in keeping the College at the heart of Lancaster and Morecambe and the many partnerships we have with local employers and community groups.

Great courses, expert knowledge...

Our courses are led by qualified tutors with a wealth of industry knowledge and experience. Our teaching programme ensure our students leave College with a nationally recognised qualification and all the skills required to enter the world of work

Industry Placements

Industry placements are designed to enhance learning through extensive work experience. The placement will develop practical and technical skills in a role relevant to the vocational course. They give employers the chance to ensure that our students are developing the skills and experience required for relevant jobs in that field.

The skills to succeed...

We expect our students to effectively plan and manage their timetable to attend lessons, meet deadlines and to accommodate research. These are all key skills which will be crucial when they move on into employment or higher education.

Our partnerships with employers mean you gain real life understanding and experience in your chosen industry.

- Each course allows students to complete a work placement in their industry to gain experience.
- LMC delivers hundreds of Apprenticeships each year with many students progressing onto them from classroom courses.
- Our Traineeship provision offers less confident students the chance to complete a ten week work placement.
- Every subject area has links with industry to ensure their curriculum is relevant and best prepares students for a future career.

We ensure that all LMC students follow our 'Curriculum Model', designed to enhance 'career related learning' to provide more than a course.

Our students develop skills to complement their learning and prepare them to enter the world or work or further study to follow their chosen career.

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Taking our students further...

Lancaster & Morecambe College has a successful, long-standing history of working with educational and other partners across Europe. Although it takes significant advance planning, we sometimes offer shortterm work experience placements, shadowing and other activities for students that align with their vocational routes. We have found that these unique opportunities often have a profound impact on the students who take part, helping them gain a foothold in their chosen careers as well as a better understanding of the wider world.

Erasmus+

Erasmus+ is the European Union programme for Education, Training, Youth and Sport running from 2014 to 2022. The main aim of Erasmus+ is to modernise education, training and youth work across Europe. We are often also invited to develop and contribute to innovative research projects that complement existing staff and student exchanges and to widen learners' opportunities and perspectives. We have a dedicated team to develop, support and sustain international opportunities for students to study, work, volunteer, train and even teach abroad

Recent Student Work Experience Placements

We have been running European projects and student exchange programmes for over 20 years.

- Animal Studies students shadowing experts at the largest zoo in Poland.
- Health & Social Care and Childcare students working in Italy and The Netherlands.
- IT and Media students working with start-up IT companies in the Czech Republic.
- Sports and Public Services students leading children's outdoor activities in Bulgaria, Estonia and Slovakia.
- Business, Hospitality and Travel & Tourism students working in Italy.



These short-term placements offer a unique work experience, enabling students to put into practice what they have learnt in the classroom. They also benefit from an enriching cultural experience and are an excellent enhancement to a young person's CV in an increasingly competitive labour market.

FREE College bus services

People travel from all over the region to study at Lancaster & Morecambe College so, to make life easier, we offer full-time students daily return transport during term time on the routes shown below. Anyone using the College bus service will be required to wear a face covering at all times, unless they have a medical exemption. Free Stagecoach termly bus passes

Full time students living over 2 miles from College, with a household income under £35k, who are not on a free bus route, will receive a free Stagecoach termly bus pass - students should ask in The Hex when they have enrolled.

Discounted Stagecoach termly bus passes

These are available to buy from The Hex, for all students not eligible for a bus pass through the Learner Support Fund. These passes are available for part time students too – ask in The Hex.



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LMC CELEBRATE LATEST OFSTED REPORT



Staff, students and governors at Lancaster and Morecambe College celebrated their <u>latest Ofsted</u> <u>inspection</u> which graded the College as **GOOD** and recognised the improvements which have been introduced since their previous visit in 2018.

A team of Inspectors spent 4 days on the campus in early March and undertook a comprehensive inspection of all aspects of College life, concluding that students were keen to learn, felt fully supported and were prepared to progress onto employment and higher education.

Inspectors applauded the College's inclusive curriculum, which fully meets the needs of employers, learners and apprentices and incorporates sector-specific work placements and careers guidance. They noted the strong and sustainable relationships the College has developed with local community groups and businesses, highlighting LMC's central role as a strategic partner with <u>Eden Project North</u>.

Staff were praised for helping to build confidence and motivate learners, fostering a calm, safe and respectful environment and providing effective and skilful support.

The inspection team met a wide range of students and apprentices during their 4-day visit, including a number of adult learners, and were impressed with their commitment and enthusiasm. "Learners say that they have fallen in love with learning again and their programmes help them to achieve their full potential."

Principal, Wes Johnson: "I am thrilled that the inspection team from Ofsted recognise that the College is delivering on the commitments made in our strategic plan – to be shaped by our employers, to be rooted in our community and to deliver positive outcomes for all.

During my three years at the College I have really valued the fantastic commitment of our wonderful team in delivering the best outcomes for our College and community; great credit has to be paid to all staff, students and governors in achieving this outcome."

The glowing Ofsted report isn't the only recent success LMC have to shout about. Last month the latest national apprenticeship achievement data was released and it placed Lancaster & Morecambe College in the Top 20 FE Colleges in the country. Charlotte Rawes, Director or Apprentices and Employer Engagement, feels this success is down to the *"strong and sustainable relationships"* the college has built with local employers:

[•]Ofsted rightly recognised the excellent success and achievement of our apprenticeship provision and I am proud that we have increased our <u>apprenticeships provision</u> over the last 18 months by 22%, whilst continuing to improve the quality and achievement rates.

The Ofsted "Good" judgement fully endorses our apprenticeship and employer led provision, and these are fantastic results which we will continue to build on, working closely with local businesses across all sectors."

Whilst the local and national landscape has very much shifted in the months since the Ofsted inspection was carried out, the college's commitment to its learners and the wider community remains as focused as ever. Wes Johnson feels that, despite the challenges the FE sector currently faces, the College is in a strong position to continue to build on the its current success;

"The strength and commitment of the Lancaster & Morecambe College community continues to shine through since our inspection. I am proud that, during the Covid-19 lockdown, the College remained open every day to meet the needs of its most vulnerable students, manufactured masses of PPE for local health and social care providers and, in partnership with the Eggcup Food Poverty project, produced over 16,000 ready meals per production day for the most vulnerable in our community. We look forward to welcoming existing and new students back into college, as they continue progressing toward their chosen careers".

Frequently asked questions...

What measures are in place to protect my son/ daugther from Covid-19?

We recognise that we are living through very unusual and uncertain times, which we continue to adapt to. Over the summer we have been preparing the campus for the safe return of students in September, whilst continuing to innovate in the ways we deliver learning using a blend of face-to-face, online and distance learning packages for our students and apprentices.

Our first priority, as always, is to safeguard the health & wellbeing of our learners, apprentices and staff and we will continue to follow government guidance on how best to adapt the College's functions to suit the ever-changing response to Covid-19 both nationally and locally.

Students will be required to wear a mask at all times when using the College buses, and in communal areas around the College campus, unless they have a medical exemption.

If my son/daughter completes a vocational qualification, can they still go to university?

Yes! Extended Diploma courses at LMC are equivalent to three A-Levels and provide all the theory and understanding required to get to university, as well as all the practical skills and experience needed to get into work. Around 200 of our Extended Diploma students choose to progress onto university locally, nationally and internationally.

My son/daughter is looking to achieve straight A's at GCSE; is there anything for them at College?

Yes, if your son/daughter knows what career path they want to follow or what subject they would like to study at university, College can offer them a work-based, career-led route to achieving their ambition.

Extended Diploma courses at LMC are equivalent to three A-Levels and provide all the theory and understanding required to get to university, as well as all the practical skills and experience needed to gain employment. With opportunities for work experience in Europe and in the UK, additional qualifications and support for independent learning, full-time programmes at LMC provide a mature, responsible route to higher education or employment.

What happens if my son/daughter requires some additional learning support?

We provide a range of support for students and make every effort to meet their specific requirements. Support may include one-to-one support in the classroom, access to specialist equipment or learning materials provided in Braille, large print or audio files. It may also include help getting around or a sign language communicator.

You can let us know about any particular needs before your son/daughter starts College or at any time during their studies.

If you are able to make us aware of your son/daughter's needs before they start at College, we can arrange for any support or specialist equipment to be available from their first day with us.

Does the practical emphasis of College courses limit my son/daughter's future options?

Courses at LMC are designed to offer our students the skills, knowledge and understanding they need to begin a career in the area of their choice. Universities and employers often welcome the additional capability and skills gained on vocational courses, where students gain practical experience of the industry and workplace, not just an 'academic' understanding.

If your son/daughter has a clear idea of what they would like to achieve, be it university study, employment or learning particular skills, LMC can offer the course that's right for them.

All our students also have the opportunity to study Functional Skills; which includes English, maths and IT.

The College is so big — won't my son/daughter get lost in the crowd?

Although the College campus is large in comparison to many schools, your son/daughter won't be lost in the crowd. Each individual student has access to more help and support than in a traditional school environment. We offer a range of support outside the classroom, as well as in lessons.

I've heard that students take control of their own learning at College. How can I be sure my son/ daughter is doing enough work to pass?

Each student has a personal tutor who meets with them every week to discuss their progress and any issues. Tutors will also stay in touch with you via regular progress reports and parents' evenings. If you would like to speak to a tutor, you can also contact them at any time during the year – contact details will be provided when your son/daughter starts at College.

How much does a College course cost?

Students aged 16-18 can study a full time programme at College FREE of charge. Students aged 19 and over may also be eligible in some cases to study for FREE; please contact our Student Services team for more information on **0800 306 306** or **info@lmc.ac.uk**

Can I get help with the cost of course expenses?

You will qualify for help with approved course expenses such as kit, uniform, and trips if your household income is below £35,000 or receives certain means-tested benefits AND your course is 3 hours or more each week.

You will receive an 80% refund on approved items purchased for your course and must submit receipts, signed by your tutor, with your form. Refunds will be paid at the end of the first term as long as you continue to attend your course.
